

Biography of Sr. Alice Luby

Sr. Alice Luby was born in New York City in 1918 and entered the Sisters of Charity of New York in 1936, professing final vows in 1942. She held a bachelor's degree in English from the College of Mount St. Vincent and a master's degree in history from St. John's University.

Sr. Alice taught elementary school grades at: St. Peter School, Brooklyn, 1938-1941; Incarnation School, Manhattan, 1941-1947; St. Gabriel's, Queens, 1947-1956; Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, Southampton, 1965-1981; St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, Shrub Oak, 1981-1982 and St. Ignatius School, Manhattan, 1982-1986. Sr. Alice also taught high school grades at Bishop McDonnell Memorial High School, 1956-1962. She was the principal at Our Lady of Mercy, Port Chester from 1962-1965. She resided at Mount Saint Vincent Convent for one year prior to Convent of Mary the Queen, Yonkers, from 2000-2010.

Sr. Alice died on October 13, 2010 in the 75th year of her commitment, at the age of 92.
