Join Sisters of Charity of New York as we engage in the multi-year Laudato Si' Action Platform and commit to journeying together towards integral ecology, ecological conversion, and transformation. At the June 11th Congregation meeting, Sisters and Associates spoke of their desire to learn and increase awareness of and response to the seven Laudato Si' Goals, especially Ecological Education and Ecological Spirituality. Awareness and contemplation were two words that surfaced in small groups. Results from the recent Congregation Laudato Si' survey showed that Sisters and Associates were aware and responsive to many of the Laudato Si' Goals. Their desire to learn and act is strong. Many of the Laudato Si' goals overlap. Response to one is a response to several.
